Pertinent Experience

Scope Art Show: Miami, New York, Basel: 2000 - Present

Scope started with a mission to build an arena for under-represented artists and art galleries where they could gain exposure while expanding their horizons and fortifying their objectives. The experiment rapidly grew in popularity and within the first few years we were presenting shows every few months all around the world. After the trials and tribulations of this multicity circuit, the show shifted its focus to growing Miami, NYC, and Basel. This year's annual Miami Scope show will exhibit 150 international galleries and sponsor special projects that range from large scale installations to educational opportunity. Since its inception, I have been involved with Scope in every capacity - from co-founding the fair with my colleagues and friends in 2000, to working as a curator, producer and public relations coordinator, to building educational programs, to exhibiting my own art work as part of special projects or with galleries representing me. My main role today is as a consultant, curator, and researcher. I also continue to provide all interested students (6 and counting from VT) and colleagues with VIP status for all Scope related events and opportunities.

Adjunct Faculty, School of Visual Arts, Virginia Tech, Blacksburg, VA: 2019 - Present

I am currently teaching drawing classes in the School of Visual Arts in the College of Architecture, Art, and Design at Virginia Tech. The students at VT are superb and I truly enjoy working with them.

Creative Director and Producer, Augmented Mountain: 2011 - 2016

Two colleagues and I formed an augmented reality app production company called Augmented Mountain. Our mission was to bring artists up to date with emerging technologies. In total, we built nine AR apps for a range of artists and organizations including Laurie Anderson, Pratt Institute, the DUMBO Arts Festival and the Scope Art Fair (Miami, NYC, and Basel).

Director and Collection Advisor, Aeon Gallery, Niwot, CO: 2010 – 2013

As director of this independently funded gallery on the outskirts of Boulder I invited emerging curators and artists to fill the space with provocative exhibitions and installations addressing issues of race, equity, and climate change. I worked closely with owner, Cory Stafford, to improve his family's collection with work from the artists we exhibited.

Faculty Associate, School of Art, Arizona State University, Tempe, AZ: 2013 - 2019

Taught foundations classes as a faculty associate in the School of Art at ASU. Classes included 3-D design and painting.

Adjunct Faculty, Chandler Gilbert Community College, Chandler, AZ: 2013 - 2018

Taught 3-D design and sculpture classes to a diverse undergraduate student population in the Art Department of this community college. In order to introduce the students to new technologies and

modes of working, I built augmented reality technologies and landscape architecture methods into their creative assignments.

Taught 3-D design and sculpture to undergraduates, and painting and sculpture to graduate students. †
Over this five-year period, I also participated in graduate reviews at the end of each semester.

Artist and Educator, Socrates Sculpture Park, Queens, NY: Summer 2004 - Fall 2009

In 2004 I received an Emerging Artist Fellowship grant from Socrates and I exhibited in a show there titled "Field: Science, Technology, and Nature". Artists who show at the park are also asked to teach a week-long sculpture class to low-income, inner-city middle-school and high-school students. After my first class, Socrates asked me to do more workshops. Before long I was regularly teaching at the park. I also organized collaborations between Socrates and other schools in other cities, as well as on the Shinnecock Indian Reservation in Long Island, NY, and at the Scope Art Fair in New York, NY.
